New Legislation for 2025-26

AB-291 (Gipson) Teacher credentialing: credentialed educator apprenticeships.

AB-296 (Davies) Apprenticeship fairs.

AB-323 (Fong) Strong Workforce Program: work-based learning opportunities, CCCCO.

AB-401 (Muratsuchi) Career Technical Education Incentive Grant: Beginning in 2026-27, creation of four-year grant cycle.

AB-731 (Fong) Pupil instruction: dual enrollment: College and Career Access Pathways partnerships.

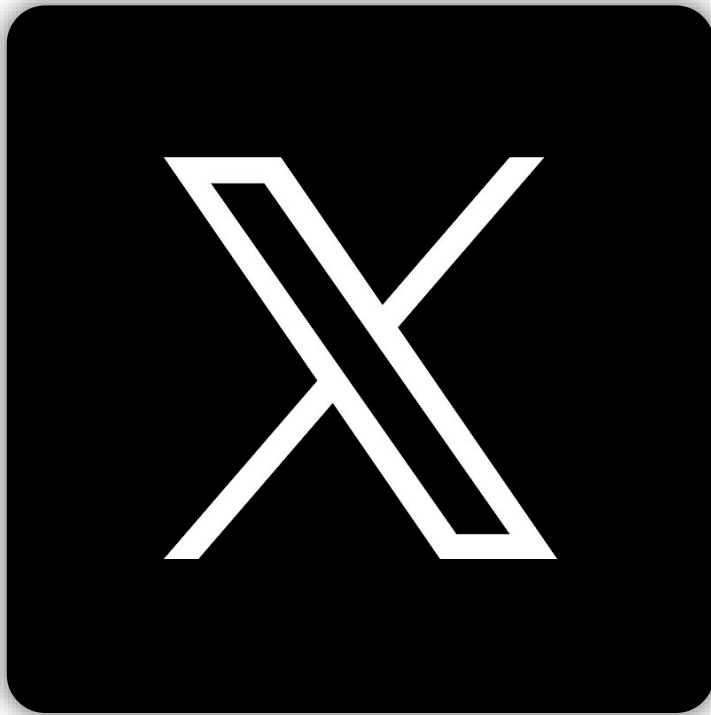
